Welcome to the 2023-2024 school year! What a beautiful summer we are enjoying. Hopefully it will continue well into the fall. As usual, the parking lot at DES has been busy with teachers and maintenance personnel working and preparing to make this year even better than the last. 22-23 will be a hard act to follow for sure! We were named a national Blue Ribbon school, our math scores were the highest they had ever been, our enrollment climbed back to pre-Covid levels, we successfully implemented a new reading curriculum, we successfully met the challenge of giving grade level instruction and intervention to a large influx of non-English speakers, and we were able to do more community events than ever before. The passage of the Alaska Read's Act legislation will be a challenge this year, but it is a challenge we are ready for. Many of the mandates required by this law, we are already doing and have been for a while. The main hurdle for us will be mandated teacher training in the Science of Reading, but we made sure we were out in front of it and many of our teachers already have met the requirement.

She has been a reading interventionist for a while at DES and has worked her way through school. We are so excited to have her in the classroom. Lizmarie Rivera will take over for Mrs. Reiter who retired from teaching Kindergarten last year. She was a special education teacher in Puerto Rico and is ready to take on a classroom position. We are also happy to add Augusta Mountcastle and Jessenia Matos-Ortiz to our permanent paraprofessional staff, and Sue Dickinson will join us as our daytime custodian.

We at DES are committed to making sure that your children receive the best possible whole-child educational experience. Our staff is resilient and ready to adapt to the changing climate of education in Alaska and our nation. Our mission is "To ensure that each student has the opportunity to engage in high quality education which includes social, emotional, physical, and academic pursuits."
